"Mindfulness for Stress Resilience" Topic of September CSUWA Meeting

STRESS can have a negative impact on our health. When confronted with stress, our bodies and minds react by going into a fight-or-flight response. Our natural instinct is to turn away, self-protect and distract from difficult emotions. Mindfulness principles and practices can be utilized to produce alternative responses. Mindfulness offers tools to help us stay present with difficult emotions, decrease our reactivity, and make choices that support one's wellbeing.

At the upcoming CSUWA Meeting on Thursday, September 8, **Sue Schneider Ph.D.**, Family and Community Health Specialist for Colorado State University Extension will present **"Mindfulness for Stress Resilience"**. Sue is a medical anthropologist, integrative health coach, and mindfulness instructor. She combines her passion for community health and individual wellbeing in her work as a Colorado State University Extension Agent where she provides leadership, programming, and education in the areas of health, wellness, and healthy aging.



Ukraine Topic of Program at Global Village Museum of Arts and Cultures

Ukraine in Context: An Historical and Personal Perspective will be presented

Thursday, Sept. 22, from 6-7:30 pm at the Global Village Museum of Arts and Cultures.

The free, in-person program will feature **John Olienyk** Ph.D., CSU Emeritus Professor of Finance whose four grandparents were born in Ukraine.

Dr. Olienyk taught at the Institute of Business and Economics in Moscow and has traveled extensively in Russia, Ukraine, Kazakhstan, and Uzbekistan. His professional experience combines with a personal perspective. "My parents were among the first generation born in the U.S.A," Dr. Olienyk said. "I grew up in a Ukrainian enclave in North Dakota, and the country's culture and traditions were deeply imbedded in me at an early age."

CSUWA Through the Years

Libbie (Libby) Coy was born September 23, 1865 on her father's farm near the recently founded town of Fort Collins, Colorado. She was one of the ten children born to John and Emily Coy, and the first white girl born in the Cache la Poudre Valley. Libbie attended Fort Collins public schools. In 1880 Libbie enrolled in the first class of Colorado Agricultural College [CAC]. She took a drawing and wood carving course taught by James W. Lawrence who in 1883 had been invited to the College to take charge of the Mechanical Engineering Department.



In 1884 **Libbie Coy** was the first woman to graduate from the Colorado Agricultural College. Libbie's only two classmates were George Glover and Leonidas Loomis.



After graduation, Libbie taught preparatory classes at Colorado Agricultural College from 1884 to early 1890.

Libbie stopped teaching to marry James Lawrence, they married on June 19, 1890. They lived in a house on Myrtle Street and had one son, George Coy Lawrence, born in 1892.

In addition to becoming president of the CAC Women's Association, Libbie was president of the Fort Collins Pioneer Society and a member of the Pioneer Women's Society. She was also historian for the Fort Collins Women's Club, established in 1889.

Libbie Coy Lawrence passed away at the age of 78 on September 18, 1944.
