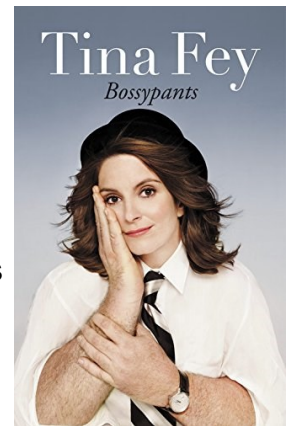

CSUWA Through the Years

Virginia Corbett served as the 8th President of the then Colorado Agricultural College Women's Association from 1919 to 1920. Born in rural Iowa in 1868, Virginia was the daughter of a rural minister and a school teacher. "Virginia graduated in 1893 from Iowa State College at Ames, Iowa. She did graduate work at the University of Nebraska and at the University of Chicago. She was an assistant to the state superintendent of the Nebraska schools and taught at the Agricultural College of Montana before becoming a professor of history and literature at Colorado Agricultural College in 1900. She later became Dean of Women. She made trips to England, Holland, Spain, and other European countries. As an exchange teacher of English, she spent a year at the Ginling College for Women in Nanking, China. It is said that her study and travels gave her a wealth of information that she shared with her classes. She was also noted for the teas and dinners that she gave in her home on 428 West Laurel Street... She was responsible for the organization of the Women's Self-Governing Association, later known as the Associated Women Students, and she helped them with their problems".

Virginia Corbett died February 13, 1932 at the age of 64.
Corbett Hall was named in her honor.
